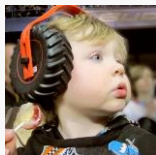


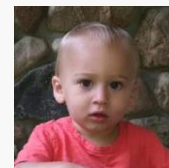
SUPPORT THREE BILLS TO SAVE CHILDREN'S LIVES

The STURDY Act ([H.R. 2211](#)) would direct the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission to create a mandatory clothing storage unit standard to help prevent tip-overs.



[Shane](#) was crushed when a dresser tipped over on top of him. He was two years old.



[Ted](#) was almost two years old when he was crushed when a dresser tipped over on top of him.



[Conner](#) died when his dresser tipped over on top of him. He was two years old.

[Camden](#) was two years old when he died after his dresser tipped over on top of him.



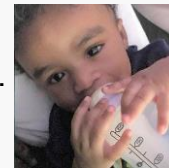
[Meghan](#) was killed when her dresser tipped over on her. She was three years old.

The Safe Sleep for Babies Act of 2019 ([H.R. 3172](#)) would ban infant inclined sleep products.

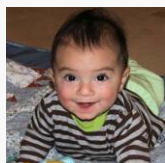


[Juliette](#) twisted over the side of a Nap Nanny and died of positional asphyxiation.

[Preston](#) rolled out of a sleep positioner and suffocated against the bumper in his crib.
